

- (a) Explain why the governments of both the North and the South attempted to limit civil liberties between 1861 and 1865. [10]
- (b) How significant was the impact of the constitutional amendments of 1865–70? [20]

6 The Gilded Age and Progressive Era, 1870s–1920

- (a) Explain why Progressive presidents changed the laws governing business. [10]
- (b) 'The expansion of railroads caused the rapid industrialisation of the late nineteenth century.'
